#### Volunteers are Lifeblood of VSA

Volunteers are the lifeblood of VSA, an all-volunteer organization. As president, I take this opportunity to recognize the people who volunteer with VSA.

As I looked at definitions for a volunteer, I could not find any that conveyed the depth of commitment and engagement that describes the VSA volunteers. We need a new name to describe the people that share their lives with the animals that need them so much.

Who would get excited about the prospect of intense responsibility that involves disturbed sleep, scheduling your life around feedings, and much cuddling of tiny beings? VSA bottle feeding volunteers, that's who! We take kittens with eyes closed and cords attached and consider ourselves lucky!

At our PetSmart adoption center, volunteers feed, scoop litter, and play with kittens who are so glad to get out their cages, play, and cuddle. As an example, if you happen by when Sarah Crain is there you will find her on the flood, listening to music, and playing with kittens. She has been doing this for years after a full day in her job at school.

We have a wonderful group of store volunteers who faithfully show up to ensure that animals are cared for. We have several mom and kid pairs who do this.

Our shot clinic is completely staffed by volunteers including veterinarians who are committed to the goal of assuring that all animals have the option of health with vaccinations and low-cost vouchers for sterilization.

All of our kittens are in foster homes. Our foster families introduce kittens to life in a home--vacuuming and door bells included. They learn to get along with other animals and what being loved and safe feels like.

Our photographer provides beautiful photos for Petfinder, the Naples Daily News, and Facebook. VSA's Board of Directors strives to discern needs in our community that are not being met and then meets those needs. Our pet food bank is an example.

Our donors provide the funds that we could not function without.

### **Volunteer Services for Animals**

VSA is a not-for-profit organization founded in Collier County in 1982 to assist at the new Collier County Animal Control shelter. VSA continues to work to bring about a time when there will be no more homeless pets. Our primary efforts are on two fronts, rescuing and adopting homeless cats and kittens and encouraging and assisting owners to sterilize their dogs and cats. VSA also has low-cost dog and cat shot clinics, a feral and neighborhood cat sterilization program, and a dog and cat food assistance program.

We have little administrative overhead. We do not maintain an office or have any paid staff. Rescued cats and kittens are housed in volunteer homes. Our work is supported entirely by donations and with grant funds. Become a part of this work of love by volunteering and/or donating.

VSA kittens and cats are available for adoption at PetSmart on Pine Ridge Road (next to Home Depot) seven days a week. VSA volunteers are at the adoption center on Saturdays and Sundays, 11:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Available kittens can also be seen on www.vsarescue.org Call 239 290-6274 for an appointment at other times.

Spay and neuter vouchers also are available at the PetSmart adoption center each Sunday from 11 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.
